





# Guiding Students from their First Day through to Graduation

We understand that moving on from primary school to second-level school is a big step for many students so we have set up a number of systems to make the transition as easy as possible. These include:

- Principal and Career Guidance Counsellor visit local primary schools
- Open Day/Enrolment
- A Welcome Evening for both parents and students
- Moving On day in June
- A special day for only First Years in August

First Year students take all subjects offered until October. Their progress and aptitudes are monitored then to help them to select the right course level and to choose two options and their subjects for the Junior Certificate.

### **Preparing for Senior Level**

In third year, students are given aptitude tests. The Guidance Counsellor meets each student with their parents to advise them on appropriate choice of subjects and courses for the Leaving Certificate, with proper regard to future career options.

### **After Graduation**

Final year students must make many important decisions. We provide advice and information on - further and higher education options; completing CAO and UCAS forms; obtaining grants and scholarships, and securing apprenticeships.

### **Recognising Achievement**

We mark the completion of second-level schooling with a graduation ceremony where every student's contribution is equally recognised. A prominent guest speaker addresses the ceremony and students are given a personalised memento of their time at school. On the following day we hold a prize giving ceremony for students from other year groups to acknowledge achievements and contributions made to school life over the year.



## Caring for All Students

Community Schools are co-ed and inter-denominational. We welcome all in the area who wish to enrol. All abilities and the various individual needs are catered for subject to the provision of resources from the Department of Education and Science.

In Bailieborough Community School, the Principal and Deputy Principal work in collaboration with all staff members to implement the Code of Behaviour which ensures that learning prevails and that individual needs are accommodated. Year Leaders, Tutors and Specialist Teachers have particular responsibility for the welfare and development of each

### Year Leader

The Year Leader is in daily contact with students in a particular Year group. The Year Leader monitors attendance, punctuality, uniform and general behaviour as well as liaising with Class Teachers, Tutors and Parents when necessary.

The Tutor takes a special interest in a particular class and meets that class regularly. The Tutor gets to know the students in that class well and through a caring relationship supports the Year Leader in monitoring progress and dealing with any personal problems.

The individual needs of students are catered for in our school by various specialist teachers who, as well as teaching, fulfil a role designed to meet specific needs, ie:
